- Non-native English speakers must demonstrate English proficiency through standardized tests.
- Letters of recommendation are required to assess applicants' suitability for the program.
- Applicants must demonstrate proficiency in a Building Information Modeling (BIM) software, showcasing their ability to effectively use these tools.
- Admission criteria aim to ensure strong educational or professional background, creative aptitude, and a genuine commitment to advancing interior design skills through ZIDA's program.

ASSESSMENT

- Practical Projects: Participants will engage in hands-on interior design projects to demonstrate their application of project management, sustainability, and professional skills.

COURSE DESCRIPTION



STUDY MATERIAL

- Students enrolled for the decorating short course need to purchase equipment. The equipment list will be discussed on the 1st session so that students can see what is required.
- Please note that all payments for equipment must be made to ZIDA. Please label all your equipment.

ASSESSMENT

- Students are required to complete a Portfolio of Evidence that will include two Interior Decor briefs. The portfolio may be used to apply for enrolment into the AdvancedInterior Design Certificate Programme offered by ZIDA. The Certificate of Competency is contingent on the successful evaluation of a Portfolio of Evidence.
- NOTE: Your Portfolio of Evidence is to be collected once your results have been released. ZIDA will only hold portfolios for 6 months after results have been released. After this time ZIDA will no longer accept responsibility to hold the portfolio.



2D AUTOCAD

SKETCH UP PRO

Facilitator: Wale Ojo Entrance requirements: Basic computer literacy Days and Times: Tuesday & Thursday: From 10:00hr Fee: 100,000 NGN

COURSE DESCRIPTION

• The purpose of this course is to provide the student with the skills and knowledge required to use the SketchUp package to quickly and efficiently generate 2D geometry and 3D models for interior design proposals.

LUMION RENDERING

Facilitator: Wale Ojo Entrance requirements: Proficient in 2D AutoCAD and Sketchup Days and Times: Tuesday and Thursday Evenings: From 10:00hr Fee: 150,000 NGN

COURSE DESCRIPTION

• The purpose of this course is to provide the student with the skills and knowledge required to master Lumion for stunning 3D renders in a 6-week program. Learn lighting, animation, landscaping, and seamless integration into design workflows. Ideal for architects and designers. Explore advanced rendering techniques applicable to virtual reality, enhancing immersive experiences for architectural visualization. Prerequisites include basic 3D modeling skills.

STUDY MATERIAL

• Students will be supplied with a reference manual

ASSESSMENT

• Completion of a competency exercise

RULES & REGULATIONS
